School Dental Van

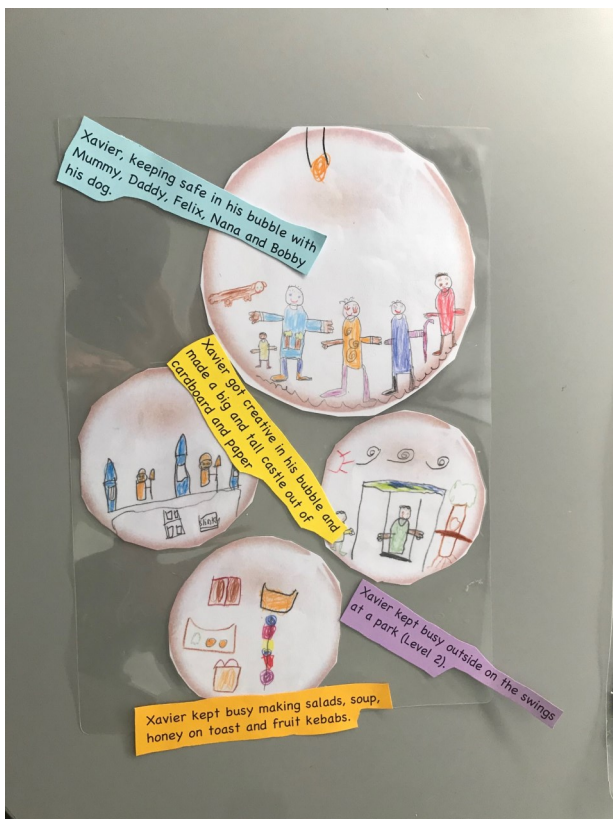
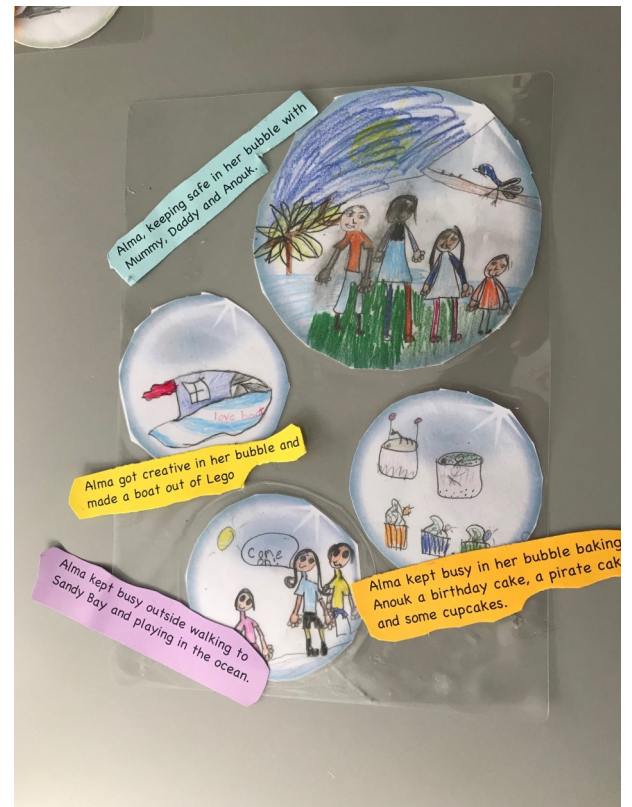
